Laketran expands alternative fueled fleet to improve efficiency

As Dial-a-Ride ridership continues to grow alongside Lake County's aging population, Laketran is aggressively trying to find ways to make the service more efficient.

One of those strategies is transitioning the 85 bus Dial-a-Ride fleet from diesel fuel to propane.

General Manager Ben Capelle explained, "There's some expenses we can't cut. You can't cut labor cost without cutting service, so we need to get a little more creative. Tightening standards for emissions and shrinking budgets have been driving the transportation industry toward alternative fuels now more than ever before and so propane is one of our solutions."

"By operating propane-fueled buses we're reducing our fuel expenses by 35% and saving on maintenance expenses," explained Capelle.

Propane is a clean burning fuel due to its low carbon content and significantly reduces smog forming hydrocarbons and greenhouse emissions, over gasoline and diesel fuels. Additionally, propane is American-made reducing independence on foreign oil.

In 2017, Laketran also added two new, smaller 8-passenger Dial-a-Ride buses, <u>Turtle Top VT3's</u>, to the fleet. The accessible bus is equipped with a wheelchair lift, safety cameras, electronic fare box, GPS-enabled automatic vehicle locators, plus radios and rangers.

"We have spent the last six months testing both our traditional Ford E-450 and new VT3 model to prepare for purchase of replacement vehicles," shared Capelle. "Both our drivers and customers have had positive feedback on how they operate."

At the Monday, January 22 Laketran Board of Trustees meeting, the board approved the purchase of 11 replacement vehicles, including six additional VT3 model buses.

"We're replacing 8 year old vehicles with 200,000 - 250,000 miles on them," explained Capelle. "There's significant maintenance savings when you can operate newer vehicles so we're continuously looking for capital funding for replacement vehicles."

Piecing together federal grants that can fund up to 80 percent of vehicle purchases, Laketran is relying on Federal Transportation Administration's Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities program that provides capital grants for transit agencies

to meet the needs of seniors and individuals with disabilities and <u>Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality</u> grants that provide federal funding for statewide transportation projects in urban areas of Ohio that need to improve congestion and air quality.

Both these programs are administered through Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency.

Laketran will award a contract to Oregon, OH based <u>TESCO bus</u> for the purchase of 11 propane buses at a cost of \$1,301,756 and expects the buses to be in operation by late summer 2018. The local 20 percent match is paid through Laketran's local sales tax levy.

"By end of 2018, we should have 35% of our Dial-a-Ride fleet transitioned to propane with 30 propane buses on the road. Our original goal was to transition the fleet in five years, but at this replacement pace we may see the cost savings even sooner," explained Laketran board president Brian Falkowski. "If we can find a way to operate more efficiently and environmentally friendly, we're going to push to do that as soon as possible."




















My struggles and reasons why my mom would benefit and thrive in a care community.

Transitioning my mom to a care community such as the Lantern can be hard and difficult. Unable to care for my mom or unable to be for her when she dearly need me the most makes me vulnerable and guilty. It is heart breaking! No one can love and care for my mom like the way I do. Exploring options to enable my mom to live at her home or at my home is definitely therapeutic and beneficial. However, a house cannot be a home unless it contains memories and experiences that my mom can relate to. How often do I as an adult child engage with her, if she lives with me or at her home? Transitioning my mom to a wonderful loving care community could be a gift I give my mom.

A home-care arrangement may not be ideal always, as my mom's home may not be designed for her safety. Environmental barriers such as rugs, floor mats and stairs could be hazardous. Bathrooms without safety designs such as grab bars and railings could place her at risk for increased falls. An environment that fosters human engagement, exercises and activities are crucial for my mom to thrive and live a life that is fulfilling to her. Early into the transition, it can be very hard for her and me. However, by extending time to adjust and acclimate can be an experience she and I may grow to embrace and cherish.

When will my mom be appropriate for a care community? In my mind, if she has one of the following-

- 1. Requires one on one care for greater than eight hours.
- 2. I'm unable to meet my mom's needs timely and appropriately.
- 3. My mom requires round the clock care.
- 4. My mom requires assistance to eat, brush her teeth, and comb her hair, dress, bathe and walk.
- 5. My mom is losing weight.
- 6. My mom is not drinking enough fluids and is dehydrated.
- 7. My mom is unable to live alone due to unknown fear.
- 8. My mom gets lost in her own neighborhood.
- 9. My mom is seeing and hearing things that I'm unable to relate to.
- 10. My mom is not taking her medications timely.
- 11. My mom is buying unwanted stuff and hoarding them.
- 12. My mom spends most of her time sitting in a couch watching TV with little to no activity.
- 13. My mom is unable to recall events from her immediate past.
- 14. My mom has incontinence issues.
- 15. I'm constantly concerned and worried about my mom's safety and wellbeing.
- 16. I'm emotionally drained and unable to emotionally care for my mom.
- 17. When mom wanders away from her home.

By having my mom in a care community doesn't make me a terrible or a bad son. In no way does it diminish my unconditional love for my mom. Choosing a wonderful care community for her is like her choosing a great school or a college for me. Sacrificing her own happiness, she loved and provided for me. Now it is my chance to give her what is fulfilling for her. Enabling her to live a life that is childlike filled with innocence and no worries of tomorrow.
