PAINESVILLE, OHIO (December 9, 2016) – The month of December is one to celebrate for the Lake County Free Clinic (LCFC). Noted by the passage of House Bill 320 in 2014, the Ohio Legislature designated December as Free Clinic Appreciation Month and recognized the importance of volunteers in free clinics. All fifty-one free clinics throughout Ohio will show their appreciation by highlighting and honoring their volunteers. Locally, the Lake County Free Clinic will do the same but in addition to the celebration of the month's dedication, the volunteers and staff will also be celebrating the recent award bestowed upon them as the 2016 Free Clinic of the Year.

"Everyone at LCFC is thrilled about receiving this honor as we all put our heart and soul into our daily work," said executive director, Johanna Henz. With no other free clinics in Northeast Ohio, the Lake County Free Clinic is in high demand and often is not able to see everyone who needs the care. The clinic stretches to do a lot with very little which is extraordinary and has caught the attention of others. Now in its 45th year, the clinic expects to exceed 22,000 medical and dental services provided by year-end. Such a large number of services from a relatively small organization is only possible by the generosity of the volunteers. At any one time there are more than 30 people volunteering and helping to carry out the clinic's mission which includes doctors, nurses, translators, and other health care professionals.

Will President Trump's Immigration Reforms Affect Your Business?

On August 31st, 2016, during the heat of the presidential campaign, many people may have seen then-presidential-candidate Trump travelling to Mexico to meet with the president of Mexico, Enrique Pena Nieto. Upon his return to the U.S. that same night, at a speech given in Phoenix, Arizona, Trump put forth his "10-Point Plan" for changes to the immigration system. At the time, business owners may not have considered Trump's plan as having any impact on their operations, but now that Trump has won the presidency, many employers are taking a closer look at his plans in order to prepare for what effects, if any, some of these plans will have on their businesses.

Several of the points in Trump's immigration plan deal directly with the border, visa issuance, and the apprehension of undocumented individuals. These measures include building a wall to span the border with Mexico, keeping those that are undocumented detained for additional periods of time, creating a deportation task force, taking funding away from state or local municipalities who pass laws restricting their involvement with the enforcement of immigration laws, blocking immigration from certain countries, and reducing the amount of legal immigration into the country. There may be little effect on the business community in Northeast Ohio as a result of most of Trump's immigration agenda in these areas of enforcement and removal of undocumented aliens, however, there are two points of Trump's plan that many employers are concerned about.

One of the points in Trump's immigration plan is to rescind the executive actions on immigration taken by President Obama. Although the majority of Obama's executive actions on immigration were struck down by the Supreme Court this year, there is one program, Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals or "DACA," that is still currently in place. DACA provides temporary work authorization and relief from deportation to those individuals who entered the United States illegally as children, have no criminal history, and have, at a minimum, a high school diploma. While DACA does not offer any path to legalization, it does provide legal work authorization to approximately one million individuals, many of whom are using their work permits to work in all types of Northeast Ohio companies. Because of the possibility that DACA will no longer exist this January under President Trump, many employers looking into how many of their employees are working pursuant to these work permits and are reaching out to immigration professionals to find out what other alternatives there may be to keep their workforce in place if those employees are no longer eligible to work.

Another point in Trump's immigration agenda that could affect all businesses is his attempt to block jobs for the undocumented by strengthening the E-Verify program. E-Verify is a federal, government-run web-based service that electronically verifies the employment eligibility of new hires. A collaboration between the Department of Homeland Security and the Social Security Administration, enrollment in the program is required for all federal contractors and subcontractors but is not currently required in Ohio. Under this part of Trump's plan, many employers may find themselves the subject of increased audits to determine workforce and I-9 compliance and to verify whether they have retained the necessary documentation to prove their employees are eligible to work.




