

Incorporating a Plan for Your Digital Assets into Your Estate Plan

Traditionally there are a number of elements of an estate plan for a person to prepare for what happens to their assets when they pass on. Traditionally you would draft a will that would be witnessed or notarized and sometimes even filed with the County Probate Court. Additionally you might have included making a durable power of attorney to allow another person to act in your place for your various financial affairs. This is especially useful if you have a debilitating illness that results in you not being able to take care of your affairs but does not kill you.

As society has progressed the need to establish who would make healthcare decisions for you and to document what specific healthcare treatments you would or would not want in certain circumstances became both possible and desirable. As such estate planning grew to include living wills and healthcare specific power of attorneys in order to designate your healthcare decision maker and any treatments that you would not want performed on you such as resuscitation or artificial breathing, hydration, or nourishment.

In recent years estate planning has begun to involve the inclusion of so called "digital assets" so that your plans and desires for those items also pass on to who you designate. These things include those items on social media sites like Facebook and Instagram; cloud file space providers like iCloud, Dropbox, and Google; eCommerce sites like eBay, Amazon, Shutterfly, Flickr, Kindle, etc.; email providers like Outlook, Gmail, and Yahoo; virtual currency sites like Venmo, Paypal, Bitcoin, ethereum, etc.; music, video, and gaming sites/accounts; blogs and on-line business sites; and travel and other rewards sites.

Reading this list you may be thinking of how much information that list encompasses. It may seem like a monumental task to try to address it. However, taking this task into steps will allow you to adequately prepare and incorporate these items into your estate plan. First, determine who in your life you want managing these items as your "digital executor." This may be the same person as the executor under your will or a different person, but if not the same those persons should know who each other are and be prepared to work together. Second, you should maintain a physical list or a digital list that compiles your passwords for all of these various online sites that is in your digital executor's possession or they have access to. This will enable your digital executor to be able to access these sites to carry out your desires after you pass on. As part of this process you will also take inventory of these items describing what is contained in them and what you want done with each. For example, you may want your digital currencies liquidated or given to your heirs whereas you may want your photos downloaded and copied for each of your children or other heirs. These instructions should also be provided to your digital executor.

Some sites and apps have specific provisions built into its system to appoint someone to be able to access your information after you pass. Both Google and Facebook have such procedures. Regardless, the final point of preparedness is to keep in mind the pace that technology changes. We have moved quickly from cassette tapes to CDs then flash media and now cloud storage. Technology advances quickly. Passwords also change frequently. Because of this it is important to review your list not less than annually and to update the passwords as you change them.

Lake-Geauga Recovery Centers, Inc. (LGRC) is a private, non-profit agency providing continuous service to the community since 1971. The Center provides a wide range of prevention and treatment services for individuals whose lives have been affected by their own or another's use of drugs or alcohol, by problem gambling, or by mental illness.

Guided by our mission statement, "To promote lifelong recovery from addiction through education, prevention, and treatment, regardless of ability to pay", our goal for treatment services is to help our consumers achieve long-term recovery and an improved quality of life. Our prevention services strive to educate the community about issues related to alcohol, other drugs, problem gambling, and focus on the reduction of abuse through sound prevention strategies.

LGRC offers expert counseling and support to individuals, families, businesses, other service providers, and the community at large, at our outpatient offices in Mentor, Painesville and Chardon. Outpatient services include:

Education Programs	Family awareness groups	Drug and alcohol testing
Ambulatory detoxification	Medication Assisted Treatment	Individual and group counseling
Intensive outpatient treatment	Aftercare	Relapse Prevention

In addition to comprehensive outpatient services, LGRC operates two long-term, non-medical, residential treatment facilities, both in Painesville. Our men's facility, Lake House, and women's facility, Oak House, are both 16 bed facilities and operate 24 hours a day, seven days a week. These programs are unique in that children age 3 and under may accompany their mothers or fathers to treatment. In addition to developing the skills, insight, and support necessary to abstain from drugs and alcohol and achieve long-term sobriety, the program assists individuals in addressing their needs for housing, relationships, vocational training, child care, education, mental health and physical health.

Supportive housing for women age 18 and over with a substance use disorder is available at our Nevaeh Ridge facility located in Mentor. This facility welcomes pregnant women and women with children ages 5 and under to live in a safe and supportive environment while they participate in intensive outpatient substance abuse treatment services. In 2018 we proudly celebrated the birth of our 18th drug free baby!

To complete the continuum of care for treatment services, LGRC offers Recovery Housing for adults who have completed a primary treatment program, are over 30-days clean and sober, who are seeking a drug and alcohol-free living environment.

For local business and industry to promote safe work environments, Drug-Free Safety Program services have been offered by LGRC since 1995. The services include: program and policy development, employee and supervisor education, drug testing and consultation. Lake-Geauga Recovery Centers is recognized by Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services and the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation as a Technical Assistance Provider for all aspects related to Drug Free Safety Programs.

Recovery from addiction, restoring healthy families is absolutely achievable. Treatment enables individuals to function successfully in their families, in the community and in their workplace.

Services at Lake-Geauga Recovery Centers are made possible due to the generous support of the Lake County Alcohol, Drug Addiction, and Mental Health Services Board, the Geauga County Board of Mental Health and Recovery Services, and United Way of Lake & Geauga Counties.







My struggles and reasons why my mom would benefit and thrive in a care community.

Transitioning my mom to a care community such as the Lantern can be hard and difficult. Unable to care for my mom or unable to be for her when she dearly need me the most makes me vulnerable and guilty. It is heart breaking! No one can love and care for my mom like the way I do. Exploring options to enable my mom to live at her home or at my home is definitely therapeutic and beneficial. However, a house cannot be a home unless it contains memories and experiences that my mom can relate to. How often do I as an adult child engage with her, if she lives with me or at her home? Transitioning my mom to a wonderful loving care community could be a gift I give my mom.

A home-care arrangement may not be ideal always, as my mom's home may not be designed for her safety. Environmental barriers such as rugs, floor mats and stairs could be hazardous. Bathrooms without safety designs such as grab bars and railings could place her at risk for increased falls. An environment that fosters human engagement, exercises and activities are crucial for my mom to thrive and live a life that is fulfilling to her. Early into the transition, it can be very hard for her and me. However, by extending time to adjust and acclimate can be an experience she and I may grow to embrace and cherish.

When will my mom be appropriate for a care community? In my mind, if she has one of the following-

- 1. Requires one on one care for greater than eight hours.
- 2. I'm unable to meet my mom's needs timely and appropriately.
- 3. My mom requires round the clock care.
- 4. My mom requires assistance to eat, brush her teeth, and comb her hair, dress, bathe and walk.
- 5. My mom is losing weight.
- 6. My mom is not drinking enough fluids and is dehydrated.
- 7. My mom is unable to live alone due to unknown fear.
- 8. My mom gets lost in her own neighborhood.
- 9. My mom is seeing and hearing things that I'm unable to relate to.
- 10. My mom is not taking her medications timely.
- 11. My mom is buying unwanted stuff and hoarding them.
- 12. My mom spends most of her time sitting in a couch watching TV with little to no activity.
- 13. My mom is unable to recall events from her immediate past.
- 14. My mom has incontinence issues.
- 15. I'm constantly concerned and worried about my mom's safety and wellbeing.
- 16. I'm emotionally drained and unable to emotionally care for my mom.
